ejoice, God is good! For 45 fruitful years, God never failed to keep His promises. Looking back, I could still recall the different seasons in the lives and ministry of God's people at SMO. Like the wandering Jews of old times, we made our spiritual journey by moving out from one place to another. For more than 35 years since the ministry started, we had rented different space and locations to serve as headquarter and student center. From SMO's inception in 1977, with Ms. Lourdes Robles-Burgess as the National Director, the ministry expanded its horizon from its office in Manila, extending to the different parts of the Philippines and became nationwide in scope. In 1994, the national office was relocated to Bacolod City, in the Visayas region, with the late Pastor Renato del Mundo taking the leadership. This was the season where God, in His goodness showered His blessings as He caused the ministry to grow spiritually and statistically. We started to conquer the school campuses through the collective evangelism and discipleship efforts of our workers and missionaries. This program yielded so much fruits in the lives of many youths nationwide. Many of them became members of the different local churches and had grown to become church leaders, Christian workers, missionaries, pastors, responsible citizens and public servants of the country. We were then encouraged to put up our very own bible school which we call, SMO-BTI (Bible Training Institute) where the youths who decided to commit their lives to serve the Lord in full-time ministry can be trained for three to four years and be sent-out to do mission work.

espite the continued spiritual blessings from the Lord, there came also a time when the inconvenience, expenses, and difficulties of transferring from one place to another caused the people from SMO to grow weary, and weak. Through the seasons of wandering, we have marched through "the wilderness of sin" for the Israelites, but also literally to us at SMO. he Promised Land, as we call it, was provided by the Lord in 2011, through an anonymous donor from Christian Aid Missions, USA. It's a three-hectare farm lot where we built: 2 dormitories for Men & Women, (with both of the dormitories' ground floor serving as temporary classrooms, library, and administrative office of our bible school); the Dining Hall which is also convertible to session hall during our scheduled activities like camps and conferences; and the latest structure - the staff and guest house. The Promised Land is also home to farm animals like: goats, pigs, chicken and ducks; and a plantation of fruits and crops, as a means of food supply to both bible school students and staff. We also open our door to Christian churches and organizations to conduct their conferences, camps, and religious activities at the Facility where they can also enjoy the blessings God has showered abundantly to SMO.

uring the height of the COVID19 pandemic last 2021, when most ministries have been shut down, God opened the way for us to pioneer a church at the Promised Land. The high school students who used to attend our bible studies in the nearby schools stayed with us at the Promised Land during the pandemic to be of help in the farm as we also help them and their families financially. It was an opportunity to disciple them, and as a result, we were able to also reach out to their families thru visitations and regular bible studies. Their families became the first members of our pioneering Church. Last June, 2022, LIFESPRING CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP CHURCH here at the Promised Land was born. The quest to reach-out to the people around the community continues on. As the local government slowly opens the different schools for a face-to-face learning to students, we thank the Lord for the opportunity given to us to once again conduct regular bible studies to elementary, high school,

and college students. What a great privilege for us to reach-out to the community thru campus ministry. Through this, there is a need for us to build another structure at the Promised Land to serve as our session hall/chapel for the gathering of the newly found church. It is our prayer that the Lord will lead us to more souls who will come to the saving knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ, more youths who will give their lives to Christ in full-time ministry, and more opportunities to pioneer a church in the different regions of our country. God is using the partnership of His people around the world - prayers and provision of support to accomplish His plan of saving people. May the Lord find us faithful as we all labor for the advancement of His kingdom here on earth.

hloe, 12, a Grade 7 student of Negros Occidental High School (NOHS), cheerfully arrives at the SMO Center at noon time bringing at least five classmates to join her for lunch, have chitchats, and eventually hear the Word of God. She is just one of the more than 50 high schoolers who regularly come to SMO Center on weekdays to have their lunch, play basketball and other sports, and listen to God's Word shared with them by SMO staff and volunteers.

Although the activity is nothing new to SMO, the COVID-19 pandemic forced the schools to prohibit inface classes, hence, the year 2022 is the return of students to campuses since then. It also allowed the Center to reopen its gates to the students which started with around 10 high schoolers in August and now close to 60 in October.

Current health restrictions still limit campus workers from entering schools so the SMO Bacolod Team focuses on maximizing the Bacolod student Center in sharing the Gospel with students. SMO opened its canteen to serve affordable lunch meals and drinks to encourage more students to have their lunch there. Headed by SMO Bacolod Coordinator, Faith Lanaza, Paul Alacre, Elmharie Rabanal, Arniel Camacho, and Fred Repollo, different bible study schedules are being conducted with their chosen groups right after their lunch, just in time to have a 15 to 20-minute sharing before they head back to their school at 1 PM.

Every Wednesdays, the Alternative Learning System (ALS) holds its classes at the SMO Center and gives a regular 1-hour sharing of the Word of God to more than 30 ALS students.

The SMO Student Center is open on Mondays to Saturdays, to High School and College students who would want to rest and study in SMO on their vacant periods until 5 PM.

od has sustained another fruitful year for SMO Bible Training Institute for bringing in another batch of freshmen this school year. But more than that, God had opened even more doors than what BTI could handle. Pandanon Elementary School and Lopez Jaena National High School both entrusted a fixed schedule for BTI students and faculty to teach and preach the gospel during their "Edukasyon sa Pagpapalahaga" (ESP) subject. SMO is given one hour every week for every class of Grade 9 to Grade 10 to hold a Bible Study.

This also serves as on the job training (OJT) of Bible students as part of their curriculum.
